

I'm not a writer, but I'll try to give you an overview of the trip. On Wednesday, april 12, 1995, 27 jumpers from the USA met at Kennedy airport in New York. The next afternoon we stew to Mascow Russia and met up with the next of the expedition members at the Hotel Russia wear Red Square in Mascow. The make-up of the group of 120 members were USA-26 (I was down Carada), England-13, Weston Europe-62, and 19 from Russia a large contingent at the European were from Holland and other than Europe were represented in the count of 62. after two days of sightspeing and coting at Minalds, we were bussed to a mittery airbare and flew in a questionable aircraft to knowinga, Siperia. We wented in Siberia for a day and a half and then left at 9 pm on Monday, april 17, 1995 for the North Pole in a large Russian cargo jet. We jumped over the Pole at 12:30 am on thesday, april 18, 1995. We existed at 10,000 feet, doing 170 mph, and the temperature at exist was probably so to 60 below zero.

a 68 year old jumper from Canada dislocated his right should litting the air on exit and dislocated dishort get his reserve out till about 1,000 feet. Another jumper lost an artic boot on exit and followed it down landing away from the designated DZ so he wouldn't lose his foot to frostbite. Both jumpers were recovered by Russian helicopters.

Npon landing the air was filled with the clicking and roar ext cameras and video and the popping of corks. The conditions were excellent for the North Pole. Sunny and only -24° Jumpors spert conjumere between 4 to 12 hours on the Pole and then were choppered 35 kilometers to an Ice airport built by the Russians for the expedition. Unother 5 to 12 hours was spent at this location waiting for a small jet cared plane to make the 6 to 8 hours turnaround flight back to Siberia. The trip to the Pole and back was from 12 to 24 hours for the group.

The next day included a helicopter trip out into the wilderness to visit and jump with some Dolgen Estimos that herd reindeers. There was a rice banquet in khatangan that included the presenting of certificates expedition widals, patches and entertainment by local Khatangans. Jumps were made the next day onto the frozen river port of the town. In event that brought most of the population to the nverbank.

after String back to Moscow, the group split up, but about to jumpers took a day trip to a Russian jump center where they made jumps from a large Russian Chopper and took String Jessens in smaller Russian choppers, It was great.

The last day was spent in Mosicow sight seeing, buying treasures and going to the Bolishow to see a ling Russian opera.

a very fired, broke, but busting with excitement group of americans arrived back at JFK on Burday, april 23, 1995. It had been threeing frustrating, adventurous marveling and worth every penny and minute It was truly a Great adventure. We also felt very happy and lucky to be back in the United States of america.

That's me holding the POPS barrer with my Marine Corps had on.

Of the 9 jumpers in the group POPS picture, I have definitely identified & seven of the group, but can only find that 6 are really POPS members.
